O'Connor, the 29 year-old son of the late Bob O'Connor, a former Mayor of Pittsburgh, is the youngest member of Pittsburgh's City Council. He represents the same neighborhoods his late father did when the elder O'Connor served on the City Council.

Before running for City Council, O'Connor began his career in public service as a Community Development Representative for U.S. Representative Mike Doyle in the Congressman's Pittsburgh District Office. Mr. O'Connor's areas of responsibility included: business development projects, housing concerns, appropriations, EPA compliance, public safety, and FEMA disaster responses. He also assisted residents with foreclosures during the 2008-2009 recession and provided guidance to low income constituents regarding energy and heating assistance. In his four plus years in this position, Corey frequently represented Rep. Doyle at community meetings and public events.

Jessica Lee is an American Jazz and Blues vocalist, songwriter (ASCAP), and recording artist, born in Manassas, VA. Lee's vocals reflect the influence of classic jazz, blues, rhythm, and blues and gospel, but always with a heavy emphasis on the blues.

Lee said that her musical motto is always been simple. "I think people starting out in this business should always study and perform something old, something new, something borrowed...but always blue," she laughed.
